

The context



Tropical Cyclone Idai made landfall on 14 March 2019 near Beira City, in central Mozambique. The cyclone brought torrential rains and winds across central Mozambique, eastern Zimbabwe and southern Malawi. Flooding caused by Cyclone Idai has affected nearly 3 million people and caused at least 678 deaths in Malawi, Mozambique and Zimbabwe.



Houses, schools, bridges, roads and health centres destroyed by flooding.



High risk to health through spread of water-borne diseases.



Children are particularly vulnerable, especially if separated from their families.



Widespread destruction of crops will result in high levels of food insecurity.
