On Saturday 22 May the Mount Nyiragongo volcano erupted near the city of Goma in North Kivu province. People have fled to the surrounding areas or crossed into Rwanda. Some 350,000 are estimated to be in urgent need of humanitarian assistance. Lava has cut off part of the main water supply to the city leaving an estimated 500,000 people without a source of safe water and at high risk of water-borne diseases. Those who are displaced are in need of shelter, food and safe water.
